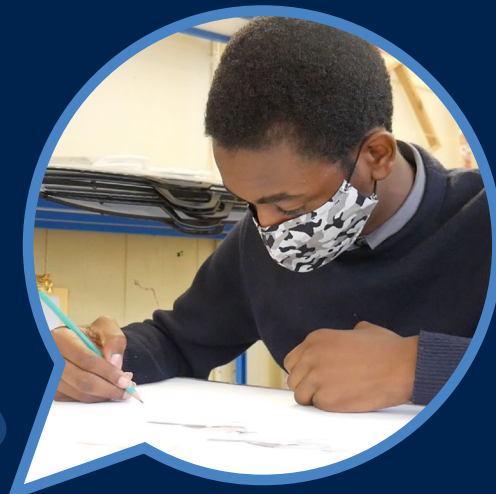

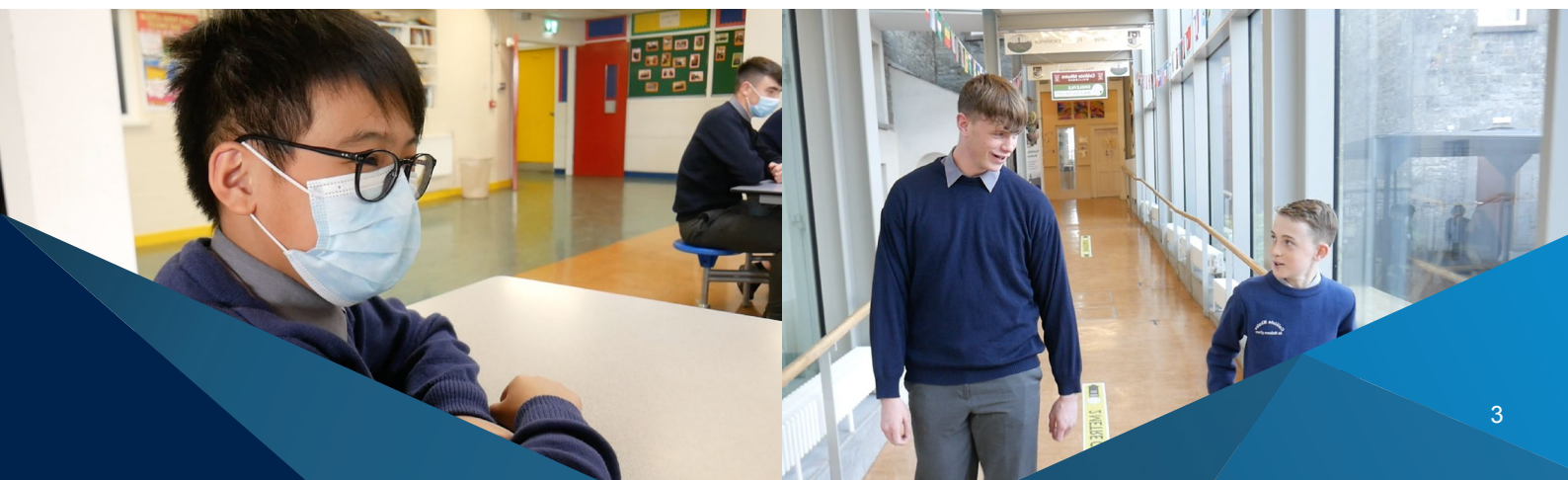

Coláiste Mhuire, Mullingar's oldest post primary school, opened its doors in 1856 with the aim of educating the poor children of the parish. This was the wish of a local brewer named James Hevey, who bequeathed the land on which the school is built. We continue to modernise and develop our school facilities, always keeping the wishes and aspirations of James Hevey alive.

Coláiste Mhuire is part of the Edmund Rice Schools Trust, which is responsible for 96 schools in Ireland. The trust supports the Board of Management and the principal in running the school, following the tenets of the Edmund Rice School Trust Charter.

Our school celebrates diversity and values difference: students of every faith, at every level of ability, of any ethnic grouping or nationality are welcome to Coláiste Mhuire.

We recognise the uniqueness of each individual, and care for the development of the student in every sense, as they grow up happy and safe in a caring community where holistic development is nurtured.

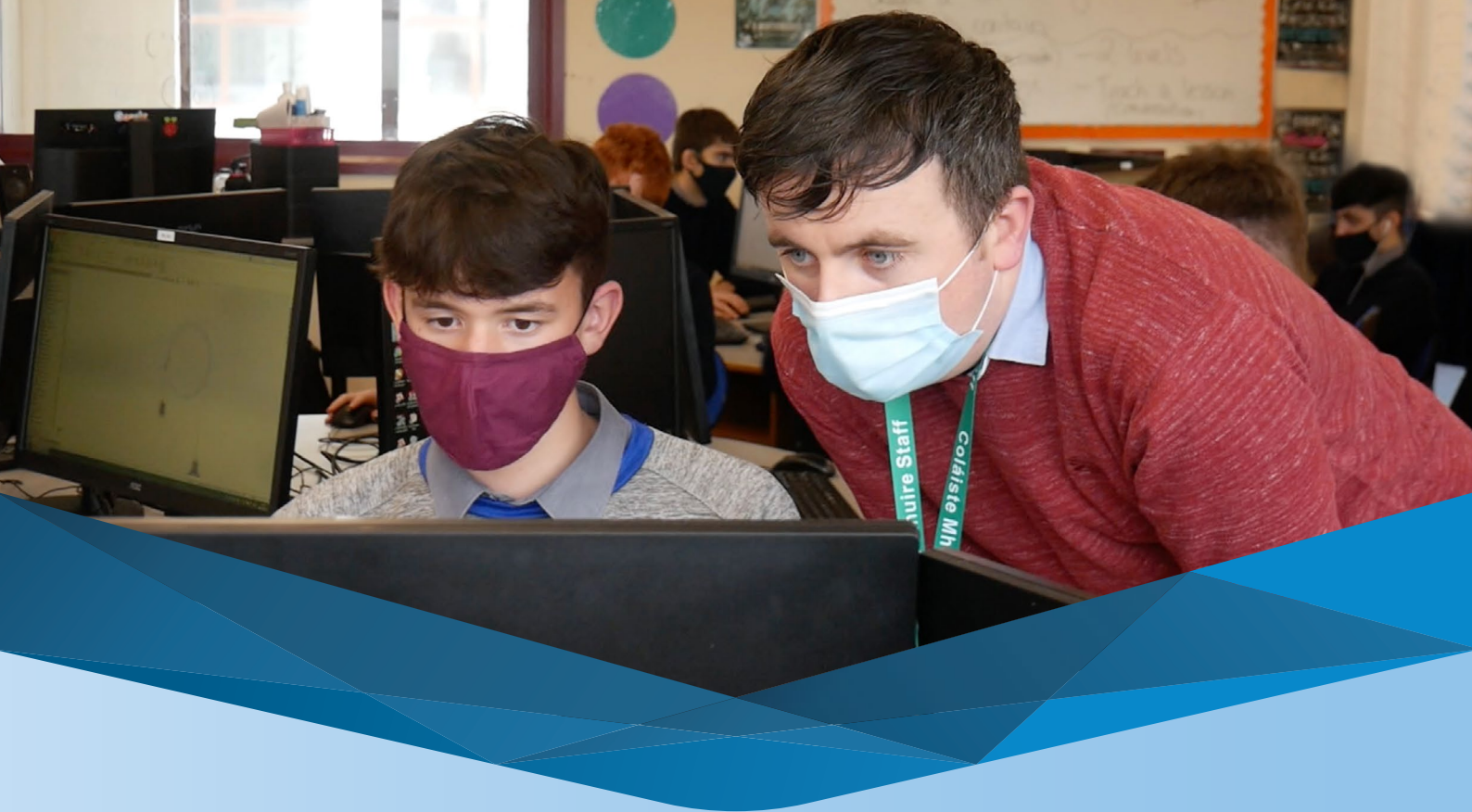

LEARNING AND TEACHING

While a holistic approach is encouraged at Coláiste Mhuire, student learning is still at the forefront. Teaching is tailored to support each student in his endeavors. Students have individual long term goals and school has its part to play in achieving these goals. Yet large successes are built on a foundation of smaller successes. Each lesson is designed in an effort to assist the student in achieving and experiencing these small successes. We are also acutely aware of the role that enjoyment plays in learning and we employ a variety of methodologies in an effort to make learning more students friendly.

In Coláiste Mhuire we use academic tracking from the time a student enters in first year, until the time he leaves. This allows us to monitor performance in a consistent manner. The confidential charting of individual student results enables our teachers to identify areas needing particular attention. This information gives the teacher an opportunity to differentiate their lessons to meet individual students' needs. We have also introduced an online learning platform in recent years. This platform acts as a support to students, allowing them access to notes and relevant materials, as they study or complete work at home.

Our literacy and numeracy programme as gone from strength to strength in recent years. An *Accelerated Reader Programme* assesses students' reading abilities and provides reading materials appropriate to those abilities. This initiative is aimed at arming students

with an increased and improved vocabulary, as well as improving student ability to comprehend and critic. The *Accelerated Reader Programme* achieves this all through the medium of reading for pleasure.

Coláiste Mhuire also has a whole school approach to numeracy. Students take tests in first year to establish their competency with numbers. Numeracy is also addressed throughout the curriculum as each department incorporates numeracy in their subject. Language support is offered in Irish, French and German. This involves exam year students receiving one to one tutoring at various times in the school calendar. The school continues to invest in ICT with the addition of class sets of Ipads and Chromebooks. This provides us with the resources to improve digital literacy and equip our pupils with the necessary skills for the wider world. Student support is also prioritised in our Team Teaching classes. In those lessons, a support teacher accompanies the lead teacher in an effort to help the boys within the class who may need further assistance.





CURRICULUM

Junior Cycle

The Junior Cycle is a three year programme that underpins our school's vision for developing our students and helps them to achieve their best. This philosophy is in line with the national Junior Cycle Framework that aims to enable students to achieve their full potential and contribute to Ireland's economic, social and cultural development. Our mixed-ability approach in most subject areas affords students of all abilities the opportunity to expand on their talents and to challenge their young minds.

Students study eleven Examination Related Subjects in 1st & 2nd Year.

This reduces to nine examination subjects in 3rd Year.

As part of our student wellbeing programme, all students participate in a number of short module courses which aim to develop a sense of personal development for our students. Transition Year (optional)

Transition Year is a unique one-year programme. We have created a multifaceted course that promotes the personal, social, vocational, sporting, creative and educational development of students. Our aim is to foster the holistic and balanced development for our students. We endeavour to prepare them for their role as responsible members of society using their newly acquired life skills. Students engage in a full academic programme and also complete four periods of work experience. Throughout the year, our students are encouraged and supported to actively engage in community projects.

Senior Cycle

Coláiste Mhuire offers students the opportunity to study the Leaving Certificate Established programme. This two year course sees students take a minimum of seven subjects for examination purposes from the wide variety of subjects which students may choose from. Students are supported in their choices with comprehensive Career Guidance advice through classroom modules, aptitude testing and one-to-one guidance sessions.

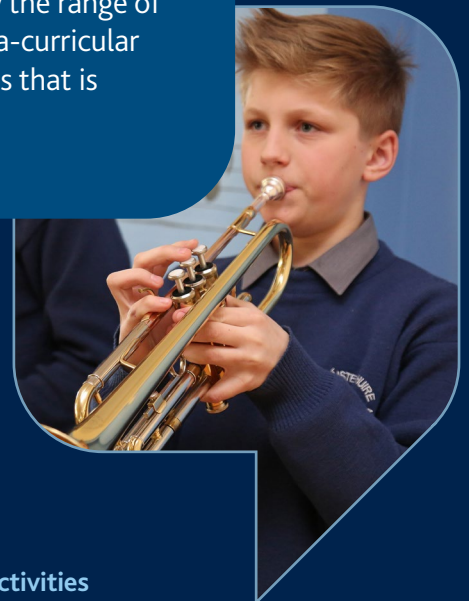

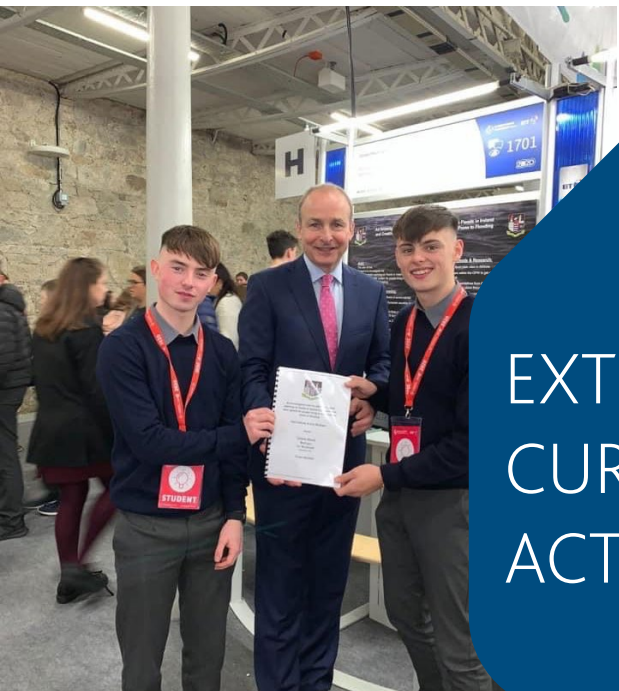

Transition Year is a unique one year programme available to our students in Coláiste Mhuire. Our programme fosters growth and development. We promote the personal, social and educational development of students and prepare them for their role as autonomous, participative and responsible members of society. Students become immersed in all activities, developing new skills and talents, engaging in an enterprise, becoming socially conscious and responsible, while nurturing their academic ability.

Transition Year enables students to make the transition from the more dependent type of learning associated with Junior Cycle towards self-directed styles in an independent environment associated with Senior Cycle and equips them with the skills necessary to achieve their full potential in the Leaving Certificate exam. It encourages the development of a wide range of transferable critical thinking and creative problem-solving skills.

Students engage in work experience which assists their decision-making around further education and career choices. Work experience is beneficial for the students. It helps them to foster independence and maturity while opening a world of responsibility and accountability.

Transition Year is a very worthwhile experience for the student who is committed to participating fully in the program. Our program in Coláiste Mhuire supports student wellbeing and affords students with the opportunity to develop a newfound confidence. It equips them with the skills to mature personally and academically through interaction with the local community and by engaging in worthwhile social awareness projects. Transition Year students avail of the opportunity to broaden their horizons, develop new friendships and create memories that last a lifetime.

A survey carried out by the Department of Education and Skills shows that students who have sat their Leaving Certificate after completing Transition Year obtained an average of 45 CAO points more than those who sat the Leaving Certificate after two years.
