Transition Year

Transition Year programme has been offered in Mercy College since 1993. Transition Year aims to -

- Promote the personal, social and educational development of the student.
- Provide the student with an opportunity for the study of topics outside the school curriculum.
- free from the pressure of examinations and the constraints imposed by an examination curriculum.
- Transition Year also gives students an opportunity to participate in work experience, educational outings and fundraising events.
- At the end of Transition Year the student is generally more focused and more mature. Statistics nationally indicate that students who have completed Transition Year score higher points in the Leaving Certificate than those who did not make the course.
- Transition year students are also less likely to drop out of college in their first year than those who have not completed the course.
- The curriculum is broad and balanced.
- Students participate successfully in a number of competitions at county, regional and national level.

Leaving Certificate

The Leaving Certificate is a two year programme. Subjects are studied at either Higher or Ordinary Level. Two subjects, Irish and Mathematics can be studied at Foundation Level. Foundation Level is geared to the needs of students who experience difficulty with those subjects at Ordinary or Higher Level.

Students usually study 6 or 7 subjects during the Senior Cycle. If following the established Leaving Certificate programme students must take at least 5 subjects including Irish.

In choosing Leaving Certificate subjects, students take note of the subjects they need for the third-level courses of their choice. For example, a student wishing to get a place on a course at one of the Universities that make up to National University of Ireland must meet a minimum entry requirement of 6 subjects, including English, Irish and a third language, Grade C on a Higher Level paper must be attained in two of these subjects.

Information about the subject requirements for each third-level course is available from the school Guidance Counsellors.
