BRIEF DESCRIPTION

CURRICULUM

Junior cycle

Junior Cert students study 9 or 10 subjects for their exams. They can choose between Higher level, Ordinary Level and for some subjects Foundation Level. The following seven subjects must be taken by all students:

- Irish
- English
- Maths
- History
- Geography
- C.S.P.E. (Civic, Social and Political Education)
- Business Studies is compulsory

All students are asked to take a modern language: French or Spanish.

A student may then take TWO of the following subjects:

- 1. Art: The course includes painting, sculpture, printing and drawing. It also includes crafts such as weaving, pottery, batik work and photography. The junior cert exam in art is practical not written.
- 2. Home Economics: The junior cert H.E course involves a lot of practical work and a practical exam at the end. It also involves food studies, consumer education, home management skills and textile skills.
- 3. Science: There are three main sections in the junior cert science course: PHYSICS: the study of heat, light, electricity, sound, etc. CHEMISTRY: the study of atoms, acids, the chemicle make up of water, salt etc. BIOLOGY: the study of plant and animal structures all body systems e.g. blood.
- 4. Music: The study of music at junior level involves learning to play a musical instrument, class singing, sight reading and taking part in a school choir. It also involves the study of the great classical composers. The music exam is written and aural.
- 5. Typing: The junior cert exam demands the following: to type accurately for ten minutes, type letters and type addresses on envelopes, type display notices, advertisements, menus etc., type information in table form, type in pre-set application forms etc.

All students must also take the following: Religious Education and S.P.H.E. (social, political and health education).

Transition Year

Transition year is a multidisciplinary programme that prepares our students for life. They learn new skills and gain in confidence to meet the challenges they will encounter in future life. With the help of teacher/student reviews and evaluation, we have changed and adapted this programme to meet the needs of our pupils.

Aim: To achieve the all-round development of the student.

Objectives: To enable students to develop into mature and independent adultsTo equip students with the skills to discern and embrace a healthy lifestyleTo enable students to grow in confidence and maturity

The course is divided into three main areas:

- The Transition in-school programme
- The world of work (4 weeks work experience)
- Transition and the community

The Transition year programme builds on the solid base of the Junior Cert and provides a good base for the Leaving Cert. There is continuity in subjects such as Gaeilge, English, Maths and Languages while students also get an opportunity to assess their abilities and strengths in relation to a wide range of other subjects. This gives the students greater insights and should be beneficial when it comes to making a choice of subjects for the Leaving Cert.

The programme is varied, enriching, challenging and relevant. It is designed to provide students with an opportunity to develop their own individual talents and strengths.

Some parts of the programme include:

 A trip to Delphi, Co. Galway for four days. Students participate in many enjoyable activities including surfing, canoeing, hillwalking, bogwalks, zipline, rock-climbing, volleyball and much more. Activities on Thursday afternoons include:
