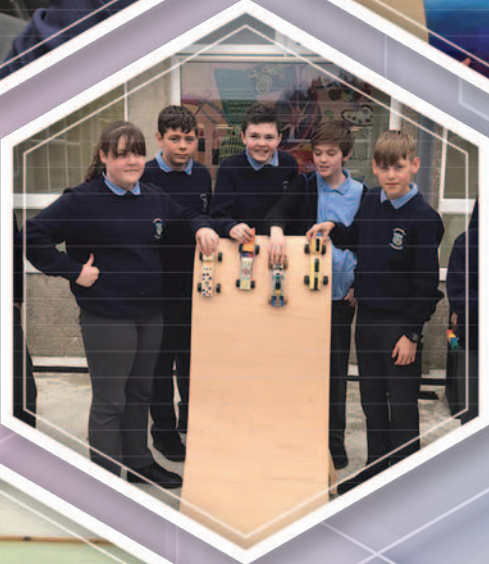

*LEAVING CERT VOCATIONAL PROGRAMME (LCVP)

This is a Leaving Cert Programme designed to give a strong vocational dimension to Leaving Cert. The programme combines the traditional Leaving Cert with a new and dynamic focus on self-directed learning, enterprise, work and community.



LEAVING CERT APPLIED (LCA)

This is a two year Leaving Certificate Programme available to students who wish to follow a practical or vocational oriented programme. Regular work experience is a central part of the course. The students' work is assessed over 2 years of the programme and they gain credits as they go along. Forms of assessment include completing tasks, practicals, interviews and terminal written papers.

STUDENT SUPPORTS:

Wellbeing

We place a strong emphasis on Wellbeing in Templemichael College. All Junior Cycle students have a timetabled class of Wellbeing each week. This is in addition to the PE/CSPE/SPHE aspects of Junior Cycle Wellbeing. We believe that students learn more effectively when they are happy in their work and feel supported by the school.

School Completion Programme (SCP):

The School Completion Programme provides a wide range of creative and innovative supports and interventions to students who may require additional help in order to complete their second level education.

Home School Community Liaison Officer (HSCL)

Templemichael College has a Home School Community Liaison Officer. The role of the HSCL officer is to support parents in the education of their child thus providing a valuable link between home and school.

Book Loan Scheme

The school operates a Book Loan Scheme whereby textbooks may be loaned on a yearly basis for a rental fee. This scheme is available to all students.





School Meals Programme

Hot School meals are provided to all students in our bright spacious canteen at Lunch times.

After School Study

Supervised after school study is currently provided four evenings per week. This is based on student demand.

Student Support Team

The Student Support Team meets weekly to ensure that those who might be experiencing any academic, social or emotional difficulties receive the supports they need to access their full education.

Learning Support Department

Learning support is provided for students with additional learning needs. In line with current thinking, our school favours the inclusion of students with learning difficulties within their class group. Such students are integrated into regular classes and/or withdrawn for interventions or specialist help when appropriate.

Mild GLD and ASD Support Classes

In addition to the Learning Support provision in Templemichael College, the school provides designated Support Classes for students with Autism Spectrum Disorders and Mild General Learning Difficulties. Students who have a recommendation on their report, that this class would best suit their needs, abilities and aptitudes, may apply for admission to the class. Career Guidance and Counselling:

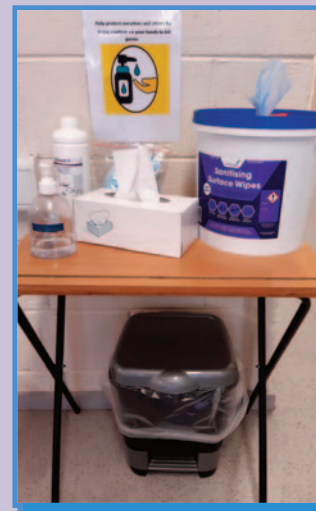




Covid 19 Procedures

At Templemichael College, we strive to create and maintain a safe environment for all our school community through the following practices:

- One-way traffic system in the school building
- Each class has a base room
- Desks are spaced to allow for social distancing in all classrooms
- Staff and Students are required to wear face masks when indoors
