First Year in Tyndall College

- Thorough supportive induction programme that starts from Sixth Class and runs throughout First Year
- First Year students engage in a taster programme. This gives them the opportunity to sample all subjects before selecting a reduced amount for their Junior Cycle. Subjects included in the taster programme are: Art, Music, Home Economics, Business Studies, Woodwork, Metalwork, Technical Graphics, Italian, Spanish, French
- All students participate in the My Friends Youth Skills for Life programme
- A student mentoring scheme is in place to help First Year students adapt to life in secondary school
- Lunchtime clubs are available, including access to the School Library
- Instrumental music lessons are available to First Year students at a reduced cost. These include flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, guitar and drums
- Free breakfast club and subsidised lunch
- Low cost assisted study programme after school
- Book rental scheme
- School start time is 8.45am and classes last for one hour each
- Uniform:
 - Tyndall College green jumper with Tyndall College crest (First – Third Year Students) Tyndall College blue jumper with Tyndall College crest (TY – Sixth Year Students)
 - White shirt
 - Navy trousers or Tyndall College patterned skirt
 - Black shoes (no runners or trainers)

<p>First Year: Tyndall College offers a taster programme to all students in First Year. This provides students with the opportunity to learn many new skills and helps them make better informed subject choices for Second Year.</p> <p>In Second and Third Year students will study subjects from the following: English, Irish, Maths, Computer Studies, Civic Social and Political Education (CSPE), Physical Education (PE), Social Personal and Health Education (SPHE), Art, Craft and Design, Business Studies, French, Geography, History, Home Economics, Italian, Metalwork, Music, Religious Education, Science, Spanish, Technical Graphics, Woodwork.</p>	<p>This is a two-year programme where students will study from the following subjects: English, Irish, Maths, Career Guidance, Physical Education, Relationships and Sexuality Education (RSE), Accounting, Agricultural Science, Art, Biology, Business, Chemistry, Construction Studies, Design and Communication Graphics, Engineering, French, Geography, Home Economics, Italian, LCVP*, Music, Physics, Religious Education, Spanish.</p>
<p>TRANSITION YEAR</p> <p>This is a one-year optional programme taken after Junior Cycle and before the two-year Leaving Certificate Programme. Students get the opportunity to sample a wide range of subject areas, engage in trips away and fun activities and gain useful work experience, which offers students an insight into the real working world.</p>	<p>*Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (LCVP)</p> <p>The LCVP is similar to a standard Leaving Certificate but with a strengthened vocational dimension. It is completed as part of the Leaving Certificate along with the other subjects you choose. It can be used for points as part of the CAO system.</p>
	<p>Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA)</p> <p>This is a two-year Leaving Certificate available to students who wish to follow a practical Leaving Certificate Programme with a vocational focus. It places particular emphasis on preparation for the world of work and life-long learning. Work experience is a significant component of the programme.</p>
